

Treating Canada Goldenrod – Follow Up

We did a cut and treat method in the fall of 2013 after the Canada Goldenrod (*Solidago canadensis*) had bloomed. It appeared to be successful after a weeks when we could see the plants were dying but the real test was what would happen a year later. You can check out the original [blog post](#). Our analysis is that this treatment worked. Best of all, it's minimal effort, minimal herbicide, and minimal collateral damage.
